To honour this milestone, we're highlighting 10 outstanding international exhibitors who have helped define the global spirit of our fair.

Tingari Arts – Alice Springs, Australia

A vital platform for Aboriginal artists, Tingari Arts brings to life the ancient Dreaming stories of the Western Desert, with vibrant canvases that are as spiritually resonant as they are visually captivating. Their exhibitions offer a rare and powerful insight into one of the world's oldest continuous cultures.

INMODERN (Art Master Gallery) – Czech Republic

For over 20 years, INMODERN (also known as Art Master Gallery) has been a premier force in contemporary East European art, situated in the heart of Prague's Old Town. It champions new and emerging voices from Ukraine, Russia, Poland, Georgia, and beyond—while also supporting established regional artists.

Diverso Art Gallery – Peru

As its name suggests, Diverso celebrates diversity in form, medium, and perspective. The gallery is known for curating strikingly eclectic exhibitions that span continents and generations, featuring emerging talent alongside established international names.

Galerie Barrou Planquart - France

This sophisticated Parisian gallery is known for its boldly contemporary take on the French art tradition, presenting thought-provoking work from European artists who push the boundaries of form, material, and concept.

Sol Art Gallery – Ireland

One of Ireland's leading contemporary galleries, Sol Art is a longtime EAF favourite. They represent a vibrant stable of Irish artists, offering a dynamic mix of modern figurative work, lyrical abstraction, and evocative landscapes.

Hisae Taki – Japan

Hisae Taki's work is marked by intimate delicacy and ethereal grace. Her layered mixed-media pieces draw from Japanese calligraphy and natural forms, inviting viewers into poetic spaces filled with emotion, memory, and light.

Delaroke - South Africa

With her signature fusion of street art, pop culture, and urban symbolism, Delaroke brings raw energy and colour to the fair. Her portraits are bold, stylized, and socially conscious—offering a dynamic voice from the global street art movement.

Sam SeYoung – South Korea

A deep thinker and visual philosopher, Sam SeYoung explores identity, impermanence, and cultural tension through moody, symbolic works that often incorporate religious and mythological motifs. His art speaks both personally and universally.

Afshin Shahidi – USA

Globally known as Prince's personal photographer, Afshin Shahidi brings a cinematic elegance to fine art photography. His work captures not just moments, but moods — often reflecting the glamour, vulnerability, and poetry of contemporary life.

Harti - Italy/Switzerland

Musician, fashion designer, and multimedia artist, Harti's work is as unorthodox as it is unforgettable. Fusing provocative visual narratives with socio-political themes, his pieces question conformity and celebrate creative rebellion.
